Opponents to Bill 80 Present Petitions to Government

Saskatchewan trades people and others opposed to Bill 80 today presented a petition signed on-line by 1238 people to the government of Saskatchewan at the constituency office of Minister of Advanced Education, Employment & Labour Rob Norris.

“We are here today to make sure that the government has heard the voices of the many Saskatchewan men and women opposed to Bill 80,” said Terry Parker, Business Manager for the Saskatchewan Building Trades. “Our construction industry is booming and its been strike free for 17 years. We’re here today to tell the government that Saskatchewan people are telling politicians **“If It Ain’t Broke, Don’t Fix It.”**”

By the government’s own admission, the construction sector in Saskatchewan is hotter than it has ever been. 2008’s \$9.8 billion in new construction investments was more than double the amount in 2004.

“For some reason, politicians want to mess with success,” said Parker. “Bill 80 will destabilize the construction industry, take money from Saskatchewan workers and contractors, and send it out-of-province”

The Saskatchewan Building Trades have held public meetings in Regina, Saskatoon and Esterhazy and have an upcoming meeting on March 21st at 7pm at the Days Inn in Estevan.

“Construction workers in Saskatchewan didn’t ask for this legislation and don’t want it. In fact, I don’t know of a single tradesperson or apprentice that supports Bill 80,” said Parker. “Bill 80 will mean lower wages for workers and more Saskatchewan construction work going to out of province contractors. We think if Saskatchewan people understand Bill 80 then politicians will be forced to do what is best for Saskatchewan and withdraw it.”
